



Certificate III in Horticulture Expression of Interest

What this course is about...

This course provides a perfect opportunity to advance skills developed through the Certificate 2 horticulture program and is ideally suited to experienced students and those who wish to add to their existing horticultural knowledge and qualifications. A certificate 2 in Horticulture or equivalent is required to participate in this course. The course covers such areas as:

- Plant identification / stage 2 advanced
- Botany; plant morphology and physiology
- Advanced propagation practices
- Soils / stage 2
- Plant nutrition
- Growing media / potting mixes
- Specialist amenity pruning
- Pest and disease management / advanced
- Indoor plant management
- Container and nursery production
- Landscape and garden management
- Turf management

The course will provide a balance between formal knowledge delivery and practically applied learning within professional horticultural environments. The program has a strong emphasis on sustainability and environmental awareness.

Students will also have the unique opportunity to participate in special horticultural projects scheduled for the Tasmanian Botanical Gardens throughout 2012.

How long does the course run?

The course will be offered as a flexible delivery program format 2 days per week over 30 weeks starting Monday March 26th 2012.

What you should know

- If you submit an expression of interest for this program, you will be required to take part in a pre-enrolment selection interview.
- You will have the opportunity to develop a comprehensive training and assessment plan with your assigned trainer/assessor.
- Assessments activities, where appropriate, will be undertaken through practical projects and on the job observation and demonstration.
- You will need to provide your own work place uniform including PPE (An RTBG work shirt is available for purchase)
- You will need to obtain or have access to a set of required texts. A list of the required texts will be provided to course participants that outline essential and desirable texts.
- You will need to provide your own pair of secateurs, pouch and knee pads.

All participants will be provided with full details of the course units, including core and selected elective units BEFORE they enrol in the course.

How will the classes be taught and assessed?

1. There will be regular scheduled seminars/lectures on specific topics for 2 or more hours per week, throughout the program.
2. You are also expected to undertake a minimum of 4 hours of additional self paced study per week and 4 hours of self-directed practical work
3. There will be one (1) regular field day per week over 30 weeks (Extra time in holiday periods can be negotiated)
4. There will be regular tutorials with industry mentor/s throughout the duration of the program.

How much does it cost?

\$1950 per participant with flexible payment options available upon request.
